#### **INTRODUCTION ABOUT ITS HISTORY**



Sport Lisboa e Benfica was founded on 28 February 1904 by a group of former students of the Royal Casa Pia de Lisboa. the "Eagle" is the main symbol of the emblem. Under the Eagle, in its grip, is the shield and a banner with the motto "E Pluribus Unum" (one for all and all for one). This motto was chosen by Félix Bermudes meaning Union and the family spirit that has always

characterized the Club since its foundation to the present day.

Is a Multisport Club, based in Lisbon, and its eclectic and history is a strong base of supporters who make Benfica the biggest and most significant Club of Portugal and one of the most prestigious in the world.

Sport Lisboa e Benfica has been one of the great responsible for dissemination of Portugal at international level, being a very important milestone in sports and social life of this country and, as a public Institution, is a club that is at the service of society.

Regardless of the sports plan Sport Lisboa e Benfica, the 27 January 2009 "the BENFICA FOUNDATION", having been recognized, 14 January 2010, by the Portuguese Government, as private Social solidarity Institution and as a Collective Person of public utility.

In July 23rd 2013 Sport Lisboa e Benfica opened the Museum Benfica-Cosme Damião, dedicated to the history of the Club which is located outside the stadium of light. In December 2014 the Museum was awarded the Portuguese Museum Prize awarded by Associação Portuguesa de Museology.

The emblem represents the characteristics that have always guided the club through time: the tone, liveliness and joy of the color of their shirts, the eagle as a symbol of their independence, authority and nobility, a bicycle wheel that represents cycling as a Of the first modalities of the club, the soccer ball and the legend with the apologia of the unit - E Pluribus Unum (of all one). It was drawn up on December 13, 1903, when the idea of creating the Club arose and the date of its foundation was February 28, 1904.




#### **DESCRIPTION**

### 4º - ESTÁDIO DA LUZ DESCRIPTION

On March 15, 1952, Joaquim Ferreira Bogalho was elected President of the Direction Do Sport Lisbon and Benfica. His main objective was to build the Estádio da Luz, which began on 14 January 1953. On 1 December 1954, History of the club with the official inauguration of the Stadium of Light with a capacity of approximately 120 000 people, being at the time the largest stadium in Europe and the third largest in the World. The demolition of the stadium began in the year of 2002 to give place to the new Stadium of Light, constructed immediately to the southwest of the old one.

### 4º - ESTÁDIO DA LUZ DESCRIPTION

The first phase of construction of the famous "Third Ring" was completed in 1960 and the stadium with a capacity for 70 000 people. Artificial lighting had been introduced two years earlier. The "closing" of the third ring was completed in 1985, bringing the stadium's official capacity to 120,000 people. Given the lack of individual places until the mid-1990s, this figure has even been exceeded on some occasions.

## 4º - ESTÁDIO DA LUZ DESCRIPTION

In the context of the Euro 2004, the former Stadium of Light was demolished and a new stadium was built in an adjacent place, and was also the stage for the final of the competition. The new Estádio da Luz was inaugurated on October 25, 2003, in a friendly game against Nacional de Montevideo, whose victory was favorable to Sport Lisboa and Benfica by 2 - 1, with goals by Nuno Gomes.





## 4º - ESTÁDIO DA LUZ <u>DESCRIPTION</u>

The project for the new Luz stadium is run by the Australian company Populousi, which has designed the Sydney Olympic Stadium in Australia and the Algarve stadium in Portugal. On November 9, 2009, the stadium surpassed 6 million spectators and on the 10th anniversary of the Estádio da Luz (October 25, 2013), the 11 million spectators were exceeded. Next to the Stadium of Light is the Benfica Museum "Cosme Damião", the Statue of Eusebio, in the Plaza of the Heroes and the Official Store of the club.

#### **DESCRIPTION**

The decade of the sixties was in the history of Benfica like "THE SEASON OF GOLD" of the soccer of Benfica, having conquered two European Cups of the European, as well as was present in several end of the Competition. The victory of the Latin Cup in 1950 was a harbinger of the great feats of the future of Benfica football, both nationally and internationally. For these feats contributed a constellation of players that will be forever linked to the history of the club, as those that some cards represented here stand out.

Alberto da Costa Pereira, (Nacala 22 of December of 1929 / Lisbon 25 of October 1990.) It was considered like one of the best Goalkeepers of Benfica and of the National Selection, having represented Benfica from the year 1954 to 1967.
